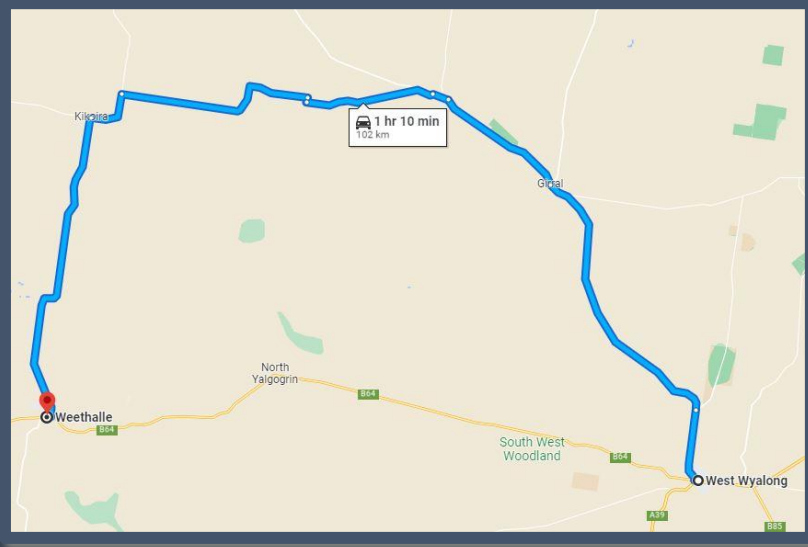


Do the Loop!

Here you will see The Big Footy, the War Murals and Rotating Globe. Take the Kikoira Road to Weethalle, this is around 45 minutes of quiet country roads. Stop off at the Silo and take a few pictures.

Weethalle is a small farming community in the Bland Shire and is situated 58 kilometres West of West Wyalong on the Mid Western Highway.

Weethalle has a population of 284, which is increased by surrounding farm populations. The town boasts a number of attractions including the first completed silo art project in NSW which was officially opened on 1 July 2017.

The Weethalle Silo

Mid-Western Highway

Stunning at first light, impressive during the hot gold hush of the day and spectacular at sunset, the Weethalle Silos continue to attract visitors from across the globe. Depicting a shearer taking fleece from a Merino sheep and a farmer standing in a paddock of wheat assessing the quality of growing grain, the impressive mural covering the iconic Weethalle Silos is a tribute to the rich agricultural heritage of the district.

The Weethalle Silos were the ninth silos to be included in the Australian Silo Art Trail and the first to be completed in New South Wales. The silos were built in 1930 and hold 2400 tonne of grain. They are 21 metres high and 31 metres wide. The silos are located across open parkland on Railway Street, the Main Street of Weethalle. There is plenty of caravan parking.

Heesco is a street artist based in Melbourne, Australia. Originally from Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, he moved to Melbourne in 2010 and has painted various artworks around the area, including a massive mural depicting a woman in traditional Mongolian dress. He was selected above 9 other Australian artists to paint the silo. His other works include the country life silo in Grenfell.
