

The Bland Shire is located on the northern fringes of the Riverina region of New South Wales. The Shire is a vibrant and progressive community that offers a safe and family friendly country lifestyle.

The Shire's major centre of West Wyalong is located on the junction of the Newell and Mid-Western Highways and within a 160 kilometre radius of Wagga Wagga, Griffith, Forbes, Parkes and Cowra, while Canberra is within 300 km – providing an authentic rural lifestyle with the conveniences of bigger centres well within reach.

The Shire offers outstanding parks and gardens, sporting and community facilities, fantastic schools, key medical and business facilities and boasts a terrific community spirit.

Communities located within the Bland Shire include Barmedman, Tallimba, Ungarie, Weethalle, Wyalong, Kikoira, Naradhan and Mirrool.





Barmedman is a village of the Bland Shire and is situated 35 kilometres south east of West Wyalong.

Barmedman is located at the half-way point en-route to Temora.

With a population of 230 people Barmedman is famous for the mineral pool, which originated from the flooding of the Barmedman goldmines by an underground stream in the 1880's. The pool is situated on a four-hectare reserve, is run by locals and is said to have some healing properties due to its high mineral content.



Mirrool

Mirrool is located 46km South of West Wyalong on the Newell Highway. Mirrool is the home of the Mirrool Silo Kick, a hotly contested football kicking competition held on the 2nd Saturday in October each year.

The area has a colourful history of settlement consisting of squatters and bushrangers. Community members wishing to save their local watering hole purchased the charming old-style Mirrool Hotel, which remains the social hub of the village.

There is a small park with a well-equipped child play area and a local camp site.




Tallimba

Tallimba is a village of the Bland Shire and is situated 35 kilometres south west of West Wyalong. The town has approximately 30 residents with the local farming communities surrounding the township increasing this number to 149 people.

Tallimba Public School caters for students in kindergarten to year 6 and a visiting playgroup operates in the community. A bus service to West Wyalong operates to transport secondary students to schools. There are also a variety of different sporting facilities, including tennis and cricket.

Although it is a small village, Tallimba has much to offer which makes it a great place to live and visit.



Ungarie

Ungarie is a village of the Bland Shire and is situated 42 kilometres North West of West Wyalong on the way to Lake Cargelligo. The village has a population of 335 residents and a farming community also supporting the village.

The town has the Humbug Creek running through it, which when full, provides a luscious surrounding. There are many things to do and see in Ungarie, which makes it a great environment to live in and visit. There are several businesses in Ungarie, offering accommodation, dining, pub and club facilities as well as essential services.

The town boasts a range of community organisations and also has a strong sporting presence with great facilities such as a bowling club, tennis courts, swimming pool and a football oval. Ungarie is also home to "The Big Footy", an attraction dedicated to the Danihers and their sporting achievements.



Weethalle

Weethalle is a small farming community in the Bland Shire and is situated 58 kilometres West of West Wyalong on the Mid Western Highway.

Weethalle has a population of 284, which is increased by surrounding farm populations. Weethalle boasts several attractions including the first completed silo art project in NSW which was officially opened on 1 July 2017.

The town is also famous for the Weethalle Whistlestop, which is an historic train station, first opened on the 8 January 1923. The station has been restored and now runs as a tea-room and craft shop.



West Wyalong

Gold was discovered at Wyalong in September 1893 by Joseph Neeld. In 1895 West Wyalong was developed 5 kilometres from Wyalong around the bullock track, without the benefit of town planning, resulting in curious kinks in the road where it avoided trees and buildings. As well as the mines, the White Tank water supply was located here. This is now the location of McCann Park. The goldfield was declared the most productive in the colony in 1899.

As mining declined, West Wyalong became the main service centre for agriculture in the surrounding district, although for many years there was rivalry between the towns. Both towns wanted the Temora railway line but settled on a compromise of a station midway between the two towns, called Wyalong Central.



Wyalong is located 4.4 kilometres from West Wyalong and is a historic town from the late gold rush years of the 1890's. In 1894 the government agreed to survey a town that would support the increasing growth resulting from the gold rush to this area. The location of the town was subject to disagreement between the government officials and the miners, who favoured a site on the western side of the diggings.

Wyalong was initially planned to be the business and residential headquarters of the region and was established in grand style with the construction of government buildings, such as a courthouse, police station, the local council hall and six hotels.

Many of the miners refused to relocate their establishments to Wyalong and as a result forced a survey of the occupied areas and the establishment of West Wyalong.



Development since the 1970s has expanded Wyalong in the direction of West Wyalong with several motels built at Central Wyalong.

A shared bicycle and pedestrian track were constructed in 1994 to link Wyalong with West Wyalong.

In 2013, the community of Bland joined Dull, Perthshire, Scotland and Boring, Oregon, USA as part of the "League of Extraordinary Communities" now known as Bland, Dull and Boring.

Domestic Assistance

Domestic assistance can support you with practical tasks such as general housework or shopping form a list. Services like these may help you the remain independent in your own home. Staff will provide assistance with the tasks you are unable to complete while promoting independence by allowing you to do the tasks you can.

Social Support & Activities

Social support services can help you to maintain an active social life by having someone visit you in your home, or by arranging visits and outings in the community. This may include attending medical appointments or shopping assistance if you are unable to attend alone.

Gentle Exercise Group

Gentle exercise program focusing on balance and falls prevention in a social environment.

Tech Talk

Tech talk session to assist seniors with technology use and better understanding of mobile phones and look at teaching you about technology.

Bland Blokes

Bland Blokes is a group of men who come together to have a cuppa, chat and an opportunity to make new friends. Bland Blokes meet from 9.30am - 11.30am Tuesday mornings at the Community Care Centre.

Ladies Coffee Morning

Ladies coffee morning gives ladies a chance to meet in a safe, friendly environment for a cuppa, chat and an opportunity to make new friends. Ladies coffee morning is held Thursday mornings from 9.30am – 11.30am at the Community Care Centre.

Goods & Equipment

Goods and equipment services can help you maintain you independence if you have a functional limitation (any health problem to prevents you from completing a range of tasks), or if you just find it difficult to carry out day-to-day living activities.

Home Maintenance

Home maintenance can provide assistance with mowing your lawns. The service is primarily for function and safety and not for aesthetic effect.

Respite Care

Respite care (also known as short-term care) is a form of support for carers. It gives Carers the opportunity to attend to everyday activities and have a break from their caring role. Respite care may be given informally by friends, family or neighbours, or by formal respite services. Respite services maybe available in your home or at the centre.

Centre Based Activity Day

Centre based activity day refer to the provision of structured group activities designed to assist people develop, maintain or support the capacity for independent living and social interaction and enables people to pursue interests and hobbies. The aim of the day is to have fun through stimulating the mind and body with activities and by mixing with other community members.

Home Care Packages

If you want to stay in your own home as you get older but need some help with things like cleaning and preparing meals, or with transport so that you can go shopping or to attend appointments, a Home Care Package may help you.

Sports and Leisure

West Wyalong is a proud and passionate sporting community with a rich history. Council has recently made a significant investment in the Shire's sporting facilities and ovals.

The \$1.5 million Perseverance Street sporting complex upgrade includes the iconic Ron Crowe Oval, the home of the West Wyalong Mallee Men and Chicks who compete in the Group 20 Rugby League competition.

Ron Crowe Oval hosts the annual West Wyalong knockout in the last weekend in February. The ground is also host to junior rugby league, touch football, community events and has the capacity to host both local and major soccer and rugby union matches.



Adjoining Ron Crowe Oval is a modern and refurbished multipurpose indoor basketball stadium, which includes two full sized basketball courts, new flooring, roofing, amenities and commercial kitchen facilities, opened in 2017. Local junior and senior basketball are held in the stadium throughout the year along with a range of other indoor sport and community activities.

Holland Park swimming pool hosts a number of major carnivals and is the base for the annual West Wyalong Gold Triathlon which is usually held in April.

A major upgrade to McAlister Oval was recently completed. The facility has previously hosted a state Little Athletics carnival and representative cricket match where a number of New South Wales cricket stars took to the pitch.

McAlister Oval is the home ground for the West Wyalong-Girral Australian Rules Football and Netball teams which compete in the Northern Riverina Football League competition.

Our Indigenous Culture

Wiradjuri people of NSW

The Wiradjuri were the largest language Group in NSW. But is made up of smaller language groups that have different dialects to the groups they boarder with, such as

Wiradjuri means "People of the three rivers" these being the Lachlan, Macquarie and Murrumbidgee rivers.

The Wiradjuri people generally moved around in small groups, using the river flats, open lands and waterways with some regularity through the seasons as indicated by debris that has accumulated in these areas

Research shows that there was one basic language used by the Wiradjuri people, however, different smaller sub groups among Wiradjuri speakers had some words that belonged exclusively to their own clan.

Occupation of the land by the Wiradjuri can be seen by modified trees and campsite remainders. Carved trees are more commonly found around the Macquarie and Lachlan rivers. Campsites, which indicate seasonal occupation by small groups, have been found on river flats, open land and by the rivers.

Wiradjuri people moved around the country according to seasonal conditions

The Wiradjuri people cover one of the largest tribal areas in NSW from Nyngan to Albury and from Hay to Bathurst




